Your child at 2 years

Milestones matter! How your child plays, learns, speaks, acts, and moves offers important clues about their development. Check the milestones your child has reached by 2 years. Don't wait. If your child is not meeting one or more milestones, has lost skills they once had, or you have other concerns, act early.

Social/Emotional Milestones

- Notices when others are hurt or upset, like pausing or looking sad when someone is crying
- Looks at your face to see how to react in a new situation

Movement/Physical Developmental Milestones

- Kicks a ball
- Runs
- Walks (not climbs) up a few stairs with or without help
- Eats with a spoon

Cognitive Milestones

- Holds something in one hand while using the other hand; for example, holding a container and taking the lid off
- Tries to use switches, knobs, or buttons on a toy
- Plays with more than one toy at the same time, like putting toy food on a toy plate

Language/Communication Milestones

- Points to things in a book when you ask, "Where is the bear?"
- Says at least two words together, like "More milk."
- Points to at least two body parts when you ask him to show you
- Uses more gestures than just waving and pointing, like blowing a kiss or nodding 'yes'

- What are some things your child likes to do?
- Is there anything your child does or does not that concerns you?

- Has your child lost any skills they once had?
