Your child at 30 months

Milestones matter! How your child plays, learns, speaks, acts, and moves offers important clues about their development. Check the milestones your child has reached by 30 months. Don't wait. If your child is not meeting one or more milestones, has lost skills they once had, or you have other concerns, act early.

Social/Emotional Milestones

- Plays next to other children and sometimes plays with them
- Shows you what she can do by saying, "Look at me!"
- Follows simple routines when told, like helping to pick up toys when you say, "It's clean up time."

Movement/Physical Developmental Milestones

- Uses hands to twist things, like turning doorhandles
- Takes some clothes off by himself, like loose pants or a jacket
- Jumps off the ground with both feet
- Turns book pages, one at a time

Cognitive Milestones

- Uses things to pretend, like feeding a block to a doll as if it were food
- Shows simple problem-solving skills, like standing on a small stool to reach something
- Follows two-step instructions like "Put the toy down and close the door."

Language/Communication Milestones

- Says about 50 words
- Says two or more words together, with one action, like "Doggie run"
- Names things in a book when you point and ask, "What is this?"
- Says words like "I", "me", or "we"

- What are some things your child likes to do?
- Is there anything your child does or does not that concerns you?

- Is there anything your child does or does not that concerns you?
- Has your child lost any skills they once had?
